Dear Coastal Dungeness Crab Fishery Participant:

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) has proposed rule changes that will require the installation of an electronic monitoring (EM) system on vessels participating in the WA coastal Dungeness Crab Fishery. Under the proposed rule, all vessels participating in the WA Dungeness Crab Fishery will be required to have a working EM system installed by January 1, 2024. WDFW recognizes that compliance with these proposed rule changes imposes a significant cost on fishery participants. To offset this impact, <u>WDFW</u> has secured funding to provide an Archipelago FishVue LIME EM system to coastal Dungeness crab fishery participants that have recently participated in the coastal commercial Dungeness crab fishery.

WDFW has developed an application process and qualification criteria to facilitate the equitable distribution of EM systems. Only one EM system will be issued per vessel, with priority given to vessels designated to a Washington coastal commercial Dungeness crab license by October 25, 2023.

Qualification to receive an EM system will be based the following criteria:

- <u>First Priority</u>: Vessels designated to a 2024 license by October 25, 2023.
- <u>Second Priority</u>: Vessels that made at least one landing during the 2022-23 season but are not designated on a 2024 license before October 25, 2023.
- <u>Third Priority</u>: Vessels that made at least one landing during the 2021-22 season but are not designated on a 2024 license before October 25, 2023.

Distribution of EM systems will begin on November 1, for qualified applicants. System availability will be dependent on funding and it's possible that not all applicants will qualify for an EM system. Vessels intending to participate in the fishery should be prepared to purchase an EM system if they don't apply before the October 25 deadline.

Vessels that have previously received an EM device as part of the EM Pilot Project are not eligible to receive a second device.

Coastal crab license owners, operators, and **alternate operators** must renew their licenses and designate the vessel applying for a device by October 25, 2023. Failure of alternate operators to renew their license will prevent processing of the coastal crab license and priority status being assigned.

An application to request an EM system is attached to this notice. Please renew all licenses and update vessel designation as appropriate and return the application in the provided envelope. WDFW will review applications and forward a list of qualified applicants to Archipelago Marine Research Ltd. for distribution. Upon receiving the EM system, vessel operators will be responsible for installing the system and activating it prior to the season start. Instructions for self-installation will be provided and operators may also contact Archipelago or a marine electrician to install the device.

An alternate operator license renewal form is also attached to this letter to help facilitate the renewal process. Alternate operator license renewals are the most common cause for delay in processing coastal crab licenses.

An alternate operator license alone does not allow an individual to operate a vessel and/or sell catch to a licensed wholesale dealer. Only those operators shown on the plastic fishery card may operate the designated vessel in that fishery.

RCW 77.65.130

Vessel operation—License designation—Alternate operator license required.

(1) A person who holds a commercial fishery license or a delivery license may operate the vessel designated on the license. A person who is not the license holder may operate the vessel designated on the license only if:

(a) The person holds an alternate operator license issued by the director; and

(b) The person is designated as an alternate operator on the underlying commercial fishery license or delivery license under RCW <u>77.65.110</u>.

(2) Only an individual at least sixteen years of age may hold an alternate operator license.

(3) No individual may hold more than one alternate operator license. An individual who holds an alternate operator license may be designated as an alternate operator on an unlimited number of commercial fishery licenses or delivery licenses under RCW <u>77.65.110</u>.

(4) An individual who holds multiple Dungeness crab—Puget Sound fishery licenses issued pursuant to RCW <u>77.70.110</u> may operate the licenses on one vessel if the license holder or alternate operator is on the vessel. The department shall allow a license holder to operate up to one hundred crab pots for each license.

(5) Two persons owning separate Dungeness crab—Puget Sound fishery licenses may operate their licenses on one vessel if the license holders or their alternate operators are on the vessel.

(6) As used in this section, to "operate" means to control the deployment or removal of fishing gear from state waters while aboard a vessel or to operate a vessel delivering food fish or shellfish taken in offshore waters to a port within the state.
