Dear Mr. Colpo:

The California Department of Health Services (CDHS) recently completed domoic acid analyses in Dungeness crab harvested during November 2005 from selected sites in Sonoma, Marin, San Francisco and San Mateo Counties. CDHS has determined that the levels of domoic acid in Dungeness crab from these areas do not pose a significant public health threat. There are no public health restrictions to commencing Dungeness crab season as scheduled on November 15, 2005. However, CDHS will continue to monitor for marine bioxtoxins and will advise industry of any potential public health risks as they arise.

CDHS would like to acknowledge the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission, California Fish and Game, Caito Fisheries, Tony Anello and Duncan MacClean for their assistance in supplying crab for analysis.
